Debris Trap: Roll, Tile, Everest, Supreme, Extreme, Tundra

ROUTINE CLEANING – VACUUMING

- 1. Equipment Use a vacuum with high suction and/or wet-dry vacuum (a vacuum with beater-bar or brushes may be recommended).
- 2. Method Slow deliberate vacuum passes are more effective. A minimum of four passes, forward and back, are recommended for effective soil removal.
- 3. Frequency

| Mat Area | Vacuuming |
|----------------|----------------------|
| Heavy Traffic | Daily |
| Medium Traffic | Every Other Day |
| Light Traffic | Once or Twice a Week |

DEEP CLEANING – MAT REMOVAL

- 1. Equipment Use a vacuum with high suction that is for wet/dry as needed. For Debris Trap Roll and Tile products, a high pressure hose may be used if necessary (not to exceed 60 PSI).
- 2. Method Remove and clean Debris Trap product. Clean substrate surface; be sure to extract all debris. It is also recommended to vacuum the product when doing the deep cleaning.

Note: Failure to remove all debris from beneath matting could cause injury and may result in excess wear which could void you warranty. 3. Frequency

| Mat Area | Vacuuming |
|----------------|-----------------|
| Heavy Traffic | Once a Week |
| Medium Traffic | Twice per Month |
| Light Traffic | Once per Month |

MONITORING YOUR MATTING

Do a walk-through inspection of all areas monthly. For optimum appearance and protection of your matting, it may be necessary to adjust the frequencies of vacuuming and deep cleaning.
